### 10 January SOUTHAMPTON, ENGLAND

Southampton, Cunard's historic home port, from which so many liners have launched through the past two centuries, is an appropriate place for your global adventure to begin upon the newest QUEEN at sea.

### 18 January

### NEW YORK, NEW YORK

After a leisurely Transatlantic Crossing, you're ready for a day ashore — and what better city than New York, where you can shop on Fifth Avenue, enjoy a walk in Central Park and take an elevator to the top of the Empire State Building.

### 21 January

### FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA

Nearby Everglades National Park is one of the most distinct ecosystems on earth. Plan a tour to take in all of the region's unusual flora and fauna, and to enjoy the balmy South Florida weather.

### 24 January

### ORANJESTAD, ARUBA

Unique among the isles of the Caribbean is Aruba, both for its Dutch-influenced architecture and its arid climate. The beaches here are among the region's best, boasting a variety of watersports opportunities.


### 26 January LIMÓN, COSTA RICA

Combining Afro-Caribbean cultural influences, colourful fishing villages and natural splendour, Limón is a port you'll find surprisingly intriguing — especially with a visit to a coffee plantation or sloth sanctuary.

### 27 January

#### TRANSIT THE PANAMA CANAL

The first of two great canal transits on your voyage, the Panama Canal is often called the Eighth Wonder of the World. This series of locks and waterways cuts through 51 miles of granite mountain and jungle.



### 29 January

### PUNTARENAS, COSTA RICA

From Puntarenas, you may want to consider a visit to Costa Rica's capital, San Jose. Here, you can tour such attractions as the Pre-Columbian Gold Museum and the historic Metropolitan Cathedral.

### 5–6 February **OVERNIGHT** SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

The "City by the Bay" is your last stop on the North American continent. Before sailing beneath the Golden Gate Bridge, take some time to enjoy sites such as Fisherman's Wharf or the food markets of the Ferry Building.

### 11 February

### HONOLULU, OAHU, HAWAII

The largest city in the Hawaiian Islands retains a leisurely pace, all the better for a day of sightseeing that might include a surf lesson on famous Waikiki Beach and a visit to the moving memorials at Pearl Harbor.

### 12 February

### LAHAINA, MAUI, HAWAII

The old whaling village of Lahaina is charming, filled with inviting shops and cafés. It's also your gateway to such attractions as the breathtaking road to Hana, the mist-shrouded Haleakala volcano and the lush lao Needle.

### 18 February

### PAGO PAGO, AMERICAN SAMOA

Dominated by the mist-shrouded Mt. Pioa, known as "The Rainmaker," Pago Pago is a vision of unspoiled South Pacific paradise. Enjoy your day here in any of a number of ways — from a beach picnic to a trip to the legendary Vaitogi Cliffs.

### 21 February NUKU 'ALOFA, TONGA

A fascinating isle of blowholes, "flying fox" fruit bats, traditional South Pacific culture and pristine beaches await you on Tonga. Don't miss a visit to the historic village of Lapaha on the eastern coast.



### 26 February

### BAY OF ISLANDS, NEW ZEALAND

A visit to Bay of Islands allows you to immerse yourself in the region's history and culture, perhaps with a visit to Waitangi Treaty Grounds, where the Maori established independence from the British Crown.

### 1–2 March OVERNIGHT

### SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA

An overnight stay and two days in the Australian capital give you an opportunity to see the city by day and night. Perhaps you'll want to take a tour of Sydney's most famous landmark the Opera House — or spend a day on Bondi Beach.

### 4 March

### BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA

While in Brisbane, why not get a taste of the local colour of this unique corner of Australia. Wineries are not far, and the national parks and native artist villages of Tamborine Mountain are a perfect day's excursion.

### 6 March

### WHITSUNDAY ISLANDS, AUSTRALIA (FOR THE GREAT BARRIER REEF)

Which of the Great Barrier Reef's unique creatures will be your favourite? You'll enjoy a day on the reef to look for such colourful denizens as seahorses, angelfish, sea turtles, manta rays and whale sharks.

### 9 March

### RABAUL, PAPUA NEW GUINEA

Located on the largest of Papua New Guinea's islands, Rabaul is surrounded by rainforest and tropical reefs. History buffs will enjoy visiting the relics of the island's role in the World War II Pacific campaign.

### AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

slopes of Mount Ngongotaha.

TAURANGA, NEW ZEALAND

Scenically set on a volcanic isthmus, New Zealand's former capital is a vibrant, exciting city and launch point for the island's renowned wineries and sites like the famous Waitomo Glowworm Caves.

### 15 March MAIDEN CALL

### KOCHI, JAPAN

Among the most intriguing attractions of this city on Urado Bay is the feudal fortress, Kochi Castle, that sits at its centre. Visit Muroto-Anan Coastal Quasi-National Park to get to know the subtropical flora of the region.

### 17 March MAIDEN CALL

### YOKOHAMA, JAPAN

The primary appeal of Yokohama is its proximity to one of the world's great cities, Tokyo. Here, in the former Edo, you can run the gamut from strolling the traditional gardens of the Imperial Palace to shopping in the neon-lit Ginza district.

### 21 March MAIDEN CALL

### NAGASAKI, JAPAN

The Peace Memorial Park and Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum highlight a difficult chapter in the city's history. Shimabara dates even further back, with its samurai village and authentic reconstructed feudal castle.

### 22 March MAIDEN CALL

### BUSAN, KOREA

Your sole stop on the Korean Peninsula will give you a good window into the culture of the region. Set out to see the royal tombs of the Silla Dynasty in Tumuli Park, or visit one of the city's countless exquisite temples.



### 19 March MAIDEN CALL

### KOBE, JAPAN

Bordered by a cobalt bay and misty mountains, Kobe offers the adventurous explorer a range of treasures from hot springs to Buddhist temples. If the timing is right, you may even see the cherry trees in blossom.

### 24 March MAIDEN CALL

### SHANGHAI, CHINA

Shanghai is the China you may have imagined — narrow streets teeming with people and bicycles, traditional ancient temples and lovely gardens in the shadow of towering modern buildings.

### 26 March MAIDEN CALL

### XIAMEN, CHINA

Spend the day here visiting beautiful Jimei Park — home to the Dragon Boat Pond and the famed sculptures of the Turtle Garden. Or tour the tiny island of Gulangyu, renowned for its colonial architecture.

### 28–29 March OVERNIGHT

### HONG KONG

With two days in Hong Kong, you'll be able to see all the sites of this intriguing city, once part of the British Empire. From mirrored skyscrapers to bustling markets in crowded alleys, it's a place of many facets.

### 31 March

### HA LONG BAY, VIETNAM

Designated a World Heritage Site by UNESCO for its iconic limestone pillars, Ha Long Bay is a geological wonder made up of some 2,000 rock islands rising hundreds of feet from the sea.

### 1 April

### CHAN MAY, VIETNAM

Located near Chan May, the city of Hue was the Imperial seat for 13 emperors of the Nguyen Dynasty. Today it's home to sites including the Royal Citadel, built in 1804, and the Palace of Supreme Harmony.

### 4–5 April **OVERNIGHT**

### SINGAPORE

Bird lovers will flock to the Jurong Bird Park, famous the world over for its 5,000 residents representing almost 400 species. An overnight stay here gives you plenty of time to see the rest of the sites, including the historic Raffles Hotel and the gold domes of the Sultan Mosque.

QUEEN ELIZABETH

### 28 April SOKHNA, EGYPT (FOR CAIRO/GIZA)

The highlight of Cairo is the Egyptian Museum, home to the famous treasures of King Tutankhamen. The spectacular Pyramids and Sphinx of Giza are among the last standing wonders of the ancient world.

### 29 April

### TRANSIT THE SUEZ CANAL

People had dreamed of connecting the Red and Mediterranean seas as far back as 2,000 B.C. French engineer Ferdinand de Lesseps came up with a practical solution in 1858, and the rest, as they say, is history.

### 2 May

### NAPLES, ITALY (FOR POMPEII/CAPRI)

Some of Italy's most appealing destinations are a short jaunt from busy Naples — including the ruins of Pompeii buried beneath the ash of a 79 A.D. eruption, and the spectacular towns and scenery of the Amalfi Coast.

### 4 May

### PALMA (MALLORCA), SPAIN

The major port city on the isle of Mallorca, delightful Palma combines Moorish, Gothic and Renaissance architectural styles in its cathedral, buildings, churches, castles and fountains, especially in the old town.

### 6 May

### LISBON, PORTUGAL

# General Information

#### RESPONSIBILITY

Transportation of guests and baggage on Cunard is governed by the Cunard Passage Contract, a copy of which will be included with your preliminary documents and is also available upon request. The Passage Contract represents the entire agreement between Cunard and the guest. It is important that you carefully read the entire Passage Contract, as it sets out the rights and responsibilities of Cunard and the guest.

Cunard shall have the right to cancel or alter in any way any scheduled sailing or itinerary which, in its sole judgment and discretion, is justified for any reason and to do so without liability for damage or for any loss to guests. Cunard also reserves the right, in the event of a full-ship charter or for any other reason, to cancel reservations and bookings whether or not a deposit or full payment has been received. In such an event, Cunard's only liability will be to refund to guests the amount it has received.

The guest is responsible for arriving at the respective ports on time for embarkation and for joining the vessel at its next port of call, if for any reason, a scheduled sailing is missed. Cunard reserves the right to refuse or discontinue passage to anyone when in Cunard's sole judgment, it would be considered a risk to the guest's own safety, well-being and health or a risk to the safety, well-being, comfort and enjoyment of any other guest or crewmember.

#### DEPOSITS

A 30% deposit is required within three days of reservation or sooner, as specified by Cunard. Staterooms are subject to cancellation if required deposit amount is not received within the specified option period.

#### BALANCE OF PAYMENT

Full payment for all voyages less than 30 days must be received by Cunard no later than 90 days prior to sailing. All reservations are subject to cancellation if payments are not received by the due date, and are guaranteed only when paid in full at 90 days prior to sailing. Final payment is due at 120 days prior to sailing on all voyages 30 days or longer. Reservations made between 90 and 31 days of sailing require full payment within 24 hours of booking. Reservations made within 30 days of sailing require full payment at time of booking.

#### METHODS OF PAYMENT

Only U.S. dollar payments are accepted via agency check, personal check, American Express, MasterCard, Visa, Diner's Club or Discover Card. Expenses incurred for on board services/ products by the guest or by Cunard on behalf of guests, shall be paid by guest prior to disembarkation.

If non-cruise components only are cancelled, the guest will be responsible for any cancellation charges imposed by the airlines, other transportation carriers, tour and ground operators or hotel properties.

#### REFUNDS

Before a determination regarding a refund can be made, all cruise and air documents must first be returned to: Cunard Line, 24303 Town Center Drive, Suite 200, Valencia, California 91355. Partial use of cruise, airfare, hotel and land extension does not qualify a guest for a refund. All refund requests pertaining to cruise, land and air are subject to final review by Cunard.

#### ON BOARD CREDIT

If you are due to receive On Board Credit this will be applied to your account on the first night of your voyage. On Board Credit cannot be used for any of the following, Cash Back, Casino/Gambling Charges, Foreign Exchange, Any Medical Services/Prescriptions, Charities or for payment of International Visas. This also applies to any gift credits that may be applied to your account.

#### CUNARDCARE

We strongly recommend that all guests purchase some form of travel protection that includes cancellation and interruption coverages as well as medical expenses and emergency evacuation benefits. For your convenience, we offer CunardCare, a package of benefits comprised of the CunardCare Cancellation Fee Waiver, the CunardCare Travel Insurance and the CunardCare Worldwide Emergency Assistance Programs designed for our most valued quests.

#### BAGGAGE AND VALUABLES

Though we take reasonable care in the handling of baggage, Cunard's responsibility for lost, damaged or misplaced baggage and other personal property is limited by the Passage Contract. Cunard Line is not responsible for camera equipment, laptops, cash or other similarly fragile and valuable items contained in checked or unchecked baggage. These items, as well as medications and prescriptions in their original packaging, should be carried on and off the ships by the guests themselves. Safedeposit boxes or in-room safes are available free of charge on board. For your safety, all guests and all baggage must pass a security checkpoint.

CHILDREN TRAVELLING WITH AN ADULT Children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult and must be at least one year of age to sail. See cunard.com for restrictions.

#### EMBARKATION/DISEMBARKATION

The ship generally will be available for embarkation four hours before the scheduled sailing time. Due to limited facilities, guests should not arrive earlier than the embarkation time noted on final documents. On disembarkation day, staterooms must be vacated at the time advised by the Hotel Manager. Once customs and immigration clearance has been completed, guests making their own air arrangements should allow three to four hours for transfer time to the airport.

Cunard Line offers optional transfers and hospitality services to the port on embarkation day. Group transfers and services use motorcoaches or minibuses; private transfers use luxury sedans for two guests or luxury club vans for four to eight guests.

Where available, hospitality services provide you with transfers from your incoming flight to a deluxe hotel at which point your luggage is transported from the hotel directly to the ship. You are free to relax and enjoy the comforts of a Cunard hospitality room and use the hotel as a base from which to explore. Contact your Travel Agent or call Cunard at (800) 728-6273 for more information.

#### GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES/SPECIAL DIETS

Guests with disabilities are welcome aboard Cunard vessels. Due to the configuration of our ships, however, wheelchair users and individuals with sight impairments may experience some difficulties in accessing certain areas. Where any individual would be unable to be safely and comfortably accommodated, we suggest that the guest be accompanied by a companion. Some ports of call require tenders to go ashore and may preclude guests using a wheelchair from leaving the vessel; this decision must be made by the ship's Captain and is binding. Upon notification by a guest with a disability, Cunard Reservations will provide stateroom and bathroom doorway widths and other pertinent access limitations on board the vessels. Cunard is pleased to permit individuals to bring service animals on board. In order to make appropriate arrangements, notice that a quest will be travelling with an animal must be provided at the time of booking. Local laws or customs may prevent animals from disembarking at particular ports and countries. It is the guest's obligation to obtain all documents/health certificates that may be required. Consult local customs authorities for information and requirements.

Guests with conditions requiring ongoing medical assistance may be asked to have their physician provide a confidential certification form to ensure that they may travel safely. If guests have special dietary needs, Cunard must be advised at time of booking or, at the latest, six weeks before sailing. Every effort will be made to comply with such requests.

#### FUEL SUPPLEMENT

Cunard reserves the right to impose a fuel supplement of up to \$9 per person per day up to a maximum of \$300 per voyage on all passengers if the NYMEX oil price exceeds \$70 per barrel, even if fares have been paid in full.

#### GOVERNMENT FEES AND TAXES

"Government Fees and Taxes" may include any and all fees, charges, tolls and taxes imposed by U.S. and/or foreign governmental or quasi-governmental authorities, including but not limited to U.S. customs fees, head taxes, Panama Canal tolls, dockage fees, wharfage fees, air taxes, hotel or VAT taxes incurred as part of a land tour, inspection fees, immigration and naturalisation fees, and Internal Revenue Service fees, whether assessed on a per guest, per berth, per ton or per vessel basis. In the case of per ton or per vessel assessments, those assessments will be spread over the guests on board. # INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL DOCUMENTS & HEALTH INFORMATION

It is the guest's obligation to obtain and carry with him/her a valid passport, visas, parental authorisations if required, and public health documents for all applicable ports of call and overland tour destinations. Your passport must be valid for a minimum of six months past the last day of your trip. Consult your travel agent for advice on such requirements. For non-U.S. citizens or non-U.S. legal residents disembarking in a U.S. port, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security requires you to provide your address while in the United States after your voyage.

Approximately three months prior to departure, guests will be sent a visa application package and requirements for their specific itinerary from an independent visa service agency. We strongly recommend that all guests avail themselves of this service. Depending on the area of the world visited, vaccination/immunisation requirements vary considerably, and are subject to change at any time. We suggest that guests travelling outside of their country of residence consider being immunised against Hepatitis A, Typhoid, Diphtheria, Polio and Tetanus. An international certificate, approved by the World Health Organization, is the best medium for verification that inoculations and vaccinations have been satisfactorily performed, and is accepted by health officials at all ports of call. We strongly recommend that all guests contact their personal physician, the Department of Public Health or the Centers for Disease Control to obtain expert medical immunisation recommendations for their intended itinerary and travel plans and to specifically address Malaria and Yellow Fever requirements in time to receive any necessary vaccinations/immunisations. Any Malaria prophylaxis medication recommended must be obtained prior to joining the vessel
